Research has shown a clear gap between skills of our nation's workforce and the basic skills needs of employers. To reduce the cost of remedial training and lost efficiency, more employers are implementing pre-employment assessments to identify these skills prior to hiring.



#### What is the NCRC?

The National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC) is a credential based upon the WorkKeys<sup>®</sup> assessments that demonstrates to employers that an individual possesses the basic workplace skills required for 21<sup>st</sup> century jobs.

Earning an NCRC allows individuals to show prospective employers they possess the basic skills employers seek.

Even if individuals have a high school diploma (or GED<sup>®</sup> credential) or a post-secondary degree, the NCRC further verifies they can handle tasks that are common and vital in today's workplaces, including finding information, reading instructions and directions, and working with figures.
